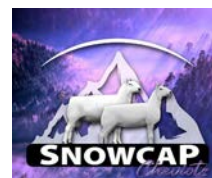

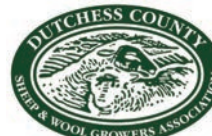

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

Purpose:

The purpose of the All-American Junior Sheep Show is to provide a weekend vacation for juniors raising sheep and their families. Social activities as well as competitive events are planned. Emphasis is being placed on meeting other youngsters and learning the attributes of all breeds of sheep. Promotional contests are designed to assist youngsters in developing marketing skills necessary for the Sheep Industry of the future.

General Rules:

1. The All-American Junior Sheep Show is open to juniors who are 21 years of age or less on January 1st and must be 4 years old as of January 1st to enter breeding sheep and market lambs. Juniors under the lower age limit are still more that welcome to participate in any other activities the show offers including assisting eligible exhibitors showing in the live animal classes.

2. Juniors showing breeding stock or entering promotional contests must be a junior member on record of their respective breed association. Juniors may exhibit more than one breed.

3. Ownership must be recorded in junior's name, chapter or club name, immediate family or farm name, unless otherwise specified by their respective breed association.

4. Deadline for ownership is July 1st. All registration certificates are required and must be duly processed by the respective breed association. Exception: Sheep purchased at public auction after May 25th, will be allowed to show with a bill of sale which identifies said sheep by breed, age and flock number.

5. Juniors must be present show day to show their own entries and be physically capable of showing their own animals, exceptions for pre-show junior exhibitor injuries/conditions and must be presented to the show committee for consideration.

6. Entries must be postmarked/received by MAY 25th. FOR 2024: This is a hard entry deadline as AAJS cannot guarantee acceptance of late entries.

Substitutions and added entries are permitted.

7. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of the following:

- **Breeding Stock:** Two entries in each single sheep class and one in each group class.
- **Market Lambs:** Two market lambs per breed.
- **Wool Show:** Two ram and two ewe fleeces.
- **Promotion Contests:** One entry per class.

8. Market Lambs may be ewes or wethers. Ewe lambs in the Market Class will not be allowed to show in the Breeding Stock Show. All Market Lambs must be slick-shorn and show no evidence of fungus.

9. Each entry will be assigned a separate number in the official catalog of the show. Ring cards with the respective entry numbers will be provided. This ring card must be brought to the

show ring by the exhibitor showing the sheep.

10. All sheep must be in place by NOON on Thursday and must remain until the close of activities on Sunday. Anyone removing sheep from the grounds without show management approval is subject to forfeiture of all premium money and awards.

11. Exhibitors should bring initial feed and bedding but additional supplies will be available for purchase.

12. All aisles must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day. All refuse matter must be disposed of in provided containers a/o areas

13. All entries for exhibits of any kind or character in this show are subject to these rules and regulations and any violation will subject exhibitors to any penalties the executive committee may order.

14. The show management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard there to, or otherwise arising out of, or incident to the show.

15. The management reserves the right to accept or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any entry of application. The management also reserves the right to personally, or appoint a committee to, inspect all entries after they have arrived and dismiss any entries that would discredit the exposition.

16. No inhumane treatment of animals will be allowed. No muzzles, painting of animals, and drenching allowed.

17. Any exhibitor making a protest shall lodge such protest with the executive committee in writing within 24 hours of the cause of the protest. Protest must be based on violation of rules. No protest shall be considered by the management unless accompanied by a deposit of \$250 cash, certified check or money order. This deposit shall be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests shall be adjudicated by the executive committee.

18. The All-American Show Managers, Committee, Breed Associations, or Fair Board of the respective fairgrounds is not responsible in case of any accidents.

19. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. Any exhibitor and/or family members may be excused from the All-American for any behavior as deemed by the executive committee.

Special Breed Rules:

If your breed has any special rules, additional rules, or information, they will be included separately by your breed association. If you have questions about special rules for your breed, please contact your breed association.

DORSET & SOUTHDOWN RULE: Sheep must be registered in junior exhibitor's name, youth partnerships accepted.

SHROPSHIRE, SOUTHDOWN & DORSET have breed specific slick shorn policies that need to be adhered to. Check with breed association for details.

SHROPSHIRE exhibitors are required to

submit to DNA collection from Champion and Reserve Champion Rams and Ewes, and also any predetermined random drawn placings.

SUFFOLKS No percentage animals allowed. Suffolks have to be purebred, registered animals to participate in the breeding sheep classes.

SUFFOLK offer two types of slick shorn class divisions so enter accordingly.

BREEDING DORPERS and **WHITE DORPERS** should be shown standing square & flatfooted with their head in a natural position. Exhibitors should refrain from aggressive bracing. All exhibitors showing in either the market or breeding divisions must be current members of the American Junior Dorper Sheep Society.

Health Requirements: HEALTH INSPECTION

There will be health inspections on Wednesday and Thursday morning (see schedule for times). All animals will need to be presented to an AAJS staff and the vet during inspection. Health papers, on all animals both in-state and out of state, will have to be signed and stickered by AAJS vet. You will have to show stickered health papers to check-in staff, before you can complete paperwork check-in on Thursday. Animals showing signs of any communicable disease will be asked to leave the barn and will not be allowed to participate in the show.

MICHIGAN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

MICHIGAN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SHEEP:

Sheep must have an official interstate certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) filled out by an United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) accredited veterinarian in the animal's state of origin for out of state sheep. Michigan sheep are also requested to have an official flock inspection report from their local veterinarian listing all attending animals individually by their official identification.

- Please note that Michigan does not issue entry permits for sheep to be imported. Therefore, no permit number is required to be written on the interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.

Sheep must have official identification (ID) regardless of age. Official ID numbers must be recorded on the CVI and in-state flock inspection report. Animals may only have one official ID tag.

Official identification options:

1. 840 Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) ear tag.
2. USDA Scrapie Tag.
3. Legible Tattoo: scrapie Flock ID with individual animal tattoo. **Tattoos are not considered official ID for slaughter or exhibition animals.**
4. Official neck strap or collar.

For use in animals that cannot be ear tagged due to absent or injured ears only.

5. Microchip (EID's)

- There are many requirements to use a microchip as the sole official ID. For more details contact the USDA Michigan office at 517-337-4705.
- **Microchips are not considered official ID for slaughter animals.**

A. General Rules for All Animals:

1. All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds will not be approved for entry.

2. Evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease or failure to produce the necessary documents for health certification, vaccination or testing will result in the animal's rejection for entry. **THE INSPECTOR'S DECISION IS FINAL.**

3. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals

which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly-licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

4. Official ID: All livestock must have proper official, individual ID as required for the species, e.g., official metal ear tag, tattoo, scrapie tag, or microchip. Registration forms must accompany health certificates when used as part of official identification.

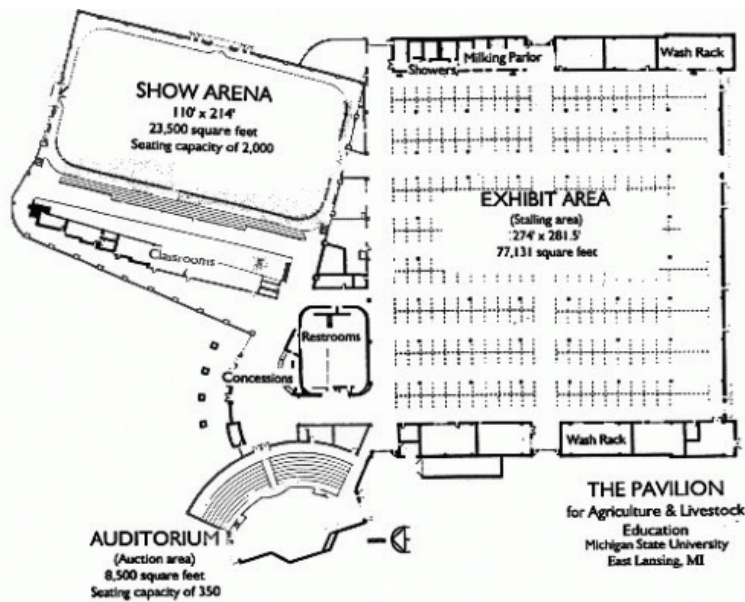
B. Sheep:

1. No sheep will be allowed entry from flocks in which Scrapie has been diagnosed or in which animals are under surveillance for Scrapie during the previous eighteen months. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP) sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA official individual identification tag or registry tattoo accompanied by current registration papers consistent with the requirements of the FSEP.

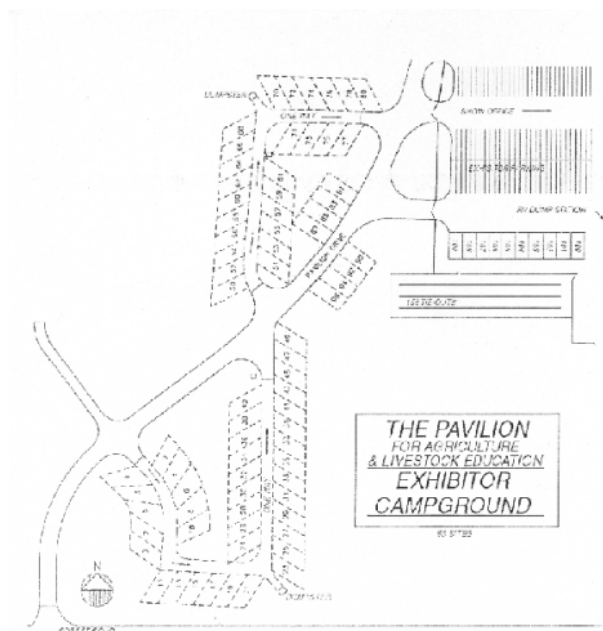
2. No sheep will be permitted entry from flocks in which sore mouth has existed or in which sore mouth Vaccine has been administered in the previous sixty (60) days.

3. Sheep must be free from visual evidence of foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye, ringworm, and open and draining wounds.

Virtual Shearing:

Entries for the Virtual Shearing contests will be done at the show and an entry form will be in your exhibitor's packet. For folks that wish to participate that aren't actual exhibitors, entries will be available at the activity site. The AAJS will offer an award for the top Adult, Senior, Intermediate, Junior, and Beginner age division. Participants are only allowed a turn one time and that score will be officially recorded.

Leadline & Dress-A-Sheep:

These new contests were added to the expanded 2019 All-American Junior Show. Please see their separate entry form for all activity details.

All-American Lamb Camp:

Lamb Camp will be conducted on Thursday from 10:00 AM to 1:30 PM for children 9 years old and younger. Participants need not be exhibitors (i.e. younger siblings) but must bring a halter broke lamb to Camp. Basic sheep information, showmanship training and sportsmanship will be taught along with other fun activities. The cost is \$10.00 per child and includes a snack/drink. An entry form is provided for lamb camp attendees. Please fill out and submit with payment at the show entry deadline. Lamb Camp graduates will be recognized at closing ceremonies. This is meant to be fun and entertaining for our child as well as a positive learning experience.

MARKET LAMB CLASSIFICATION RULES

Market Lambs will be classified by the "Three Strikes You're Out Method." One "Absolute DQ" listed results in the lamb being ineligible to show. **ALL BLANKETS AND LEG WRAPS ARE TO BE REMOVED FOR WEIGH-IN AND CLASSIFICATION.** Any lamb entering the ring on show day exhibiting an absolute DQ as listed can also be asked to leave by show/breed officials.

Cheviot:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Solid pink nose
2. White hooves
3. Long ears and/or extremely long neck
4. Excessive brown or black hair (more than 25%)
5. Wool cap
6. Wool below the knees

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Horns or solid scurs
2. Absence of white hair (frosting) on face and legs of black lambs
3. Steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled

Hampshire:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Broken wool cap
2. Very fine or thin hair on face or legs
3. Scurs
4. Excessive white hair on jaw or legs (more than 25%)

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Steep hip and genetic tendency to be double-muscled
2. Horns
3. Speckled face so that the lamb appears to be a "brockle"
4. Excessively dark or blue hide
5. Inadequate wool covering on head and legs

Natural Colored:

Any animal that is at least 35% Natural Colored excluding head and legs is acceptable

Oxford:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Long droopy, black ears
2. Bare face
3. Black spots in wool or hair
4. Inverted eyelids

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Speckled face and/or legs
2. Horns or solid scurs
3. Lack of top-knot
4. Long, slick, droopy black ears
5. Steep hip and genetic tendency to be double muscle and white spots on the ear

Shropshire:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Coarse or long, droopy ears
2. Coarse or roman nose
3. Excessive white on face, ears or legs
4. Legs completely bare of wool below the knee and hock
5. Black arm-pits or black spots in skin or wool

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Horns
2. Lack of wool cap
3. Steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled

Polled Dorset:

All Polled Dorset Market Lambs must have registration papers at check-in

"Champion Dorset Market Lamb eligible for the CDC Wether Incentive Program if all requirements are met."

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Large ears and/or droopy
2. Fine textured silky hair covering
3. Dewlaps, excessive loose skin or large wrinkles and folds
4. Hooves with excessive black striping

4. All black woolled, colored woolled or spotted woolled lambs.

Horned Dorset:

All Horned Dorset Market Lambs must have registration papers at check-in

"Champion Dorset Market Lamb eligible for the CDC Wether Incentive Program if all requirements are met."

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Large ears and/or droopy
2. Fine textured silky hair covering
3. Dewlaps, excessive loose skin or large wrinkles and folds
4. Hooves with excessive black striping
5. Any color other than pink on the nose, septum or mouth
6. Any dark colored spots in the haired portion of sheep
7. Horns that curve backward, grow in a backward curve, or the tips of the horns grow inward and close to the neck

Absolute disqualifications:

2. A completely black or dark colored lining of the mouth or nose
3. The presence of highly objectionable dark color (as defined in Highly Objectionable Traits #6) on the haired portion of two or more anatomical regions. The head (nose, face and ears) is considered on anatomical region and each individual leg is considered an anatomical region.
4. All black woolled, colored woolled or spotted woolled lambs.
5. Lack of horns

All Dorset Advantage Market Lambs must have registration papers at check-in

Dorset Advantage Market lambs will be sifted at weigh-in if necessary

Montadale:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Solid pink nose
2. Completely white hooves
3. Excessive wool cap
4. Heavy wool covering below the hock and knee
5. Excessive brown or black hair (more than 25%)

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Horns
2. Excessive dark coloration that lamb appears to be a "brockle"
3. Absence of white hair (frosting) on face and legs of black lamb
4. Steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled

Southdown:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. Solid white hair color on muzzle
2. Pink nose
3. Excessive white on face, ears or legs
4. Completely slick ears
5. Pink or striped hooves
6. Black spots in the fleece

7. Open pool on the head

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Speckled face or legs
2. Horns or solid scurs
3. Solid black lambs
4. Steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double muscled

Tunis:

3 of the following will result in disqualification:

1. White blaze past the eyes
2. Black or brown skin
3. Black hooves
4. 3 or more black spots larger than a quarter.
5. If the lamb does not fall in the tan to red (cinnamon) color range.

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Horns or solid scouts
2. White Socks
3. White or Black lambs
4. Steep hip and a genetic tendency to be double-muscled

Suffolk:

Absolute disqualifications:

1. Full wool cap
2. Wool below the knees
3. White coloring on head or legs
4. White stripes on the hooves
5. Black hided (silver hided is okay)
6. Steep hip and genetic tendency to be double muscled

Dorper/White Dorper:

3 of the following will result in disqualification

1. Tall, leggy, shallow, narrow bodied lambs.
2. A limited amount of spots on body and underline not to exceed a total of 4 square inches (size of softball).
3. A white sheep with brown or red colored speckles in the covering confined to the neck and head.
4. Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm, and britch).
5. Wool forward of poll.
6. Heavy horns.
7. Long, pendulous ears.
8. Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute disqualifications:

1. All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly, forearm, or britCh
2. Wool below the knees or hocks.
3. Wool on the ears.
4. Sheep with more than 4 square inches (softball size) or cumulative color back of the heart girth.
5. Solid brown, red or rust colored head.
6. Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.
7. Strong breed characteristics of breeds other than Dorper or White Dorper.
8. Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
9. Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
10. Evidence of color alterations.

Texel:

3 of the following will result in a disqualification:

1. Wrinkles on body
2. Black or brown wool
3. Dewlaps on neck

Absolute disqualification:

1. Pink or brown nose or feet
2. Black or brown spots larger than a quarter that extends into fleece

Champion and Reserve Champion Market Lambs receive embroidered market lamb blanket with AAJS Logo donated by Weaver Leather.

ADDITIONAL AWARDS:

Winners of each Breed Class, Showmanship Class and Team Showmanship Class, Breed Fleece Contest, Promotional Contest Division, Skill-A-Thon Division, Judging Contest Division, Leadline Class Division, Dress-A-Sheep Class, Ag Olympics, Cornhole Tournament, and Virtual Shearing Class Division will receive an AAJS Class Winner Award.

TOP GUN AWARDS:

Points Scale:

For contest 1-4:

1st place receives 25 points descending to 1 point for 25th place

For contest 5:

1st place will receive their respective points, all others receive 4th place points

For contest 6-8:

1st, 2nd and 3rd placings receive their respective points, all others receive 4th place points

Points accumulation:

Please Note: For exhibitors showing more than one breed—Make sure to designate on the *Main Entry Form* in the *Promotional Entry Section* which breed promo, showmanship, Skill-A-Thon & judging points should be designated to.

Points accumulate for each breed for the first four competitions listed. Points accumulated in the last four competitions are added to the exhibitor's designated breed from the *Main Entry Form*.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The All-American Junior Show is strictly a volunteer effort, so keeping your calls to a minimum will really help your respective breed secretaries complete your regular work (i.e. your registration papers & transfers).

We have continually tried to develop the All-American without an overwhelming number of rules so this show can be stress-free and fun for our sheep families. We have found that many questions have been the result of trying to make things harder than they really are.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS:

Q. Our flock is registered in more than one of our children's names, how do we enter them at the All-American Show?

A. You may enter different sheep for each of your children or simply enter them all in one child's name. For All-American purposes each exhibitor needs to be designated as one name only because Top-Gun Award is a belt buckle which we have yet to figure out how to divide!

Q. How early can we arrive? How late can we stay?

A. You may arrive NO EARLIER than 12:00 NOON on Tuesday and must leave no later than MIDNIGHT on Sunday.

Q. What if we need a late arrival or early release?

A. Check-in must be done by 11:30 am on Thursday and everyone MUST STAY through the end of Closing Ceremonies on Sunday. Exceptions will only be made in case of family emergencies, disabled vehicles and "Acts of God" -- not to attend other shows. (However, if you get delayed in route, please come and we will accommodate you) You may call 401-829-1360 in case of emergency.

Q. After we entered, circumstances have arisen that prevent my child from attending and/or showing his own sheep. What can we do?

A. Please contact the AAJS as soon as possible so the penning chart can be revised. With regard to return of entry fees, the Executive Committee

will then review each circumstance and make decisions on an individual basis.

Q. We are bringing other kids with us who are not exhibitors, can they still participate in any contest?

A. Absolutely, (if younger kid) lamb camp participants need not be exhibitors, but should be entered on the Lamb Camp form. Also the Cornhole Tourney, Ag Olympics, Skill-a-thon, Judging Contest, and showmanship(s) are open to non-exhibitors. You are encouraged to enter them like an exhibitor so that cards for those contest can be pre-printed and they can still receive an exhibitor packet and shirt.

Participation cards for these contests can also be obtained or entered at the show and any extra kids are welcome to participate.

Q. How do I know my entries were received?

A. We do not mail any confirmation, but do send a pre-show email with some final information. You can always check with us to make sure that your entries were received.

Q. How is the penning chart assigned?

A. Families will automatically be penned together but siblings with different last names need to be noted on the main entry blank so they do not get overlooked. Also, preference for those exhibitors' animals traveling in one trailer may also request penning together. Again, please make this request on the main entry form. Friends that want to be penned together can list the names on the main entry form but the AAJS cannot guarantee you will be penned together. The show has grown so much in size this is becoming an impossible task to facilitate.

Q. Will there be bedding available for purchase? How do I order what I need?

A. Bedding/hay pre-orders available on July 2nd. Contact: Karen Scovill - 517-651-6860, email: scovillsheepcity@wowway.com. Straw, shavings and hay available, no bagged feed. Cost is \$10.00 for hay & shavings, \$7.00 for straw. Pre-Show deliveries will be made to the exhibitors' pens.

Pre-Show Order forms will be made available on AAJS FB Page and Website closer to the show. Product available during actual show days from MSU. Payment due upon arrival for pre-orders to the MSU staff.

Q. Where do I park my trailer?

A. There will be designated areas to park your livestock trailer. Watch for signs or you will be instructed at the Welcome Desk.

Q. Is there a fee for parking on the grounds?

A. There is no fee to park on the show grounds.

Q. Where/How do we load and unload?

A. There are multiple unloading access areas around the Michigan State Livestock Pavilion and South Barn. Please find the access closest to your penning assignment, unload and move your trailer to a designated trailer parking area as soon as you have unloaded so your fellow exhibitors may go next.

Q. What are the special rules for this show site?

A. Smoking in the barns is not allowed. Dogs must be on leashes at all times while on the premises. Bicycles, scooters and in line skates are prohibited in the MSU Livestock Pavilion Complex. NO show/camp kitchen set-ups in the tack areas as it is a drain on the electrical sources that exhibitors need for fitting purposes. Please dispose all sharps materials in the sharps containers provided. All exits shall remain free and clear at all times and fire lanes around the MSU Livestock Pavilion Complex during the event also need to be free and clear hence no parking of cars/trucks allowed in the immediate area next to the MSU Livestock Pavilion Complex. Designated areas are set-up for vehicle and trailer parking. Generators are allowed in use outside of buildings. NO pop-up tents are to be used in the building. There is limited use of pop-ups around the building. They have to be 10 feet apart and flame retardant.

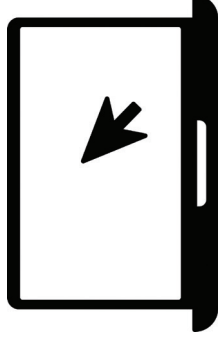
